Mile High Early Learning is Denver's oldest and largest provider of subsidized quality early care and education

Providing High Quality Early Care and Education

Mile High Early Learning offers high quality year-round programs to children ages 6 weeks to 5 years in seven early learning centers that serve many of Denver's most under-resourced neighborhoods.

- **557 infants, toddlers, and preschoolers** participated in our Montessori inspired early learning programs at our centers and partner sites this past year.
- **91% of families** live at or below the Federal Poverty Level (\$25,750 for a family of four), and many experience housing instability, food insecurity, are dual language learners and newcomers to the country.



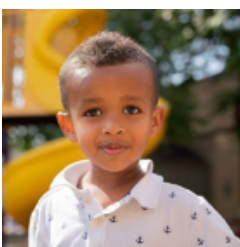
COVID Impact and Response

Building upon the theme from Stone Soup, we moved quickly to launch Nourishing Our Community – providing food and educational resources to support children's health and well-being and continued learning at home.

- **7,950 meals** were distributed to MHEL families. We also distributed home learning kits in partnership with Denver Museum of Nature and Science and Denver Zoo.
- **Financial assistance** was given to families to help them purchase essential items and pay bills and rent.
- **511 children enrolled** in our center-based programs received early education programming through remote learning.
- **796 children received educational resources** including book bags with learning activities.
- **285 parents and Family, Friend, and Neighbor caregivers** received daily activities for their children through WhatsApp.
- Provided **iPads to 60 families** without technology so their children can participate in our remote educational activities from home.

Engaging Parents and Family, Friend, & Neighbors

Through **Babies Ready for College** and its suite of programs, we serve over 500 parents and caregivers and their children each year – equipping parents and caregivers with vital information about how children's brains grow and ways to facilitate that growth so that their children will succeed in school.



Training Early Childhood Educators

We provide education and training with hands-on practical experiences to early learning professionals through our nationally recognized Professional Learning Center, which includes job-embedded coaching and professional learning for our teachers plus three continuing education programs:

- **Child Development Associate**
- Inclusive Practices in **Early Childhood Credential**
- **Master of Arts** in Learning, Developmental and Family Sciences
